MORE ON MONASH (CLAYTON) MEDICINE INTERVIEW PROCESS

The new Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) for the **Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery** will, most likely, consist of **eight sequential 'stations'** plus one rest station. In each station the applicant will be interviewed by one interviewer for eight minutes followed by two minutes for scoring/changeover. Therefore, **each 'circuit' of nine stations will take 90 minutes** to complete. Interviews will take place over the same time period as previous years (ie late November-mid December).
